Teaching Respect: Carterton School 3Rs



Hi my name is Kimberley and I have been the parent representative, since last year, on the team which implements our school behaviour management system affectionately known as 3 R's

You have probably heard your child chatting about clicks, badges, mahi pai, or mention green, yellow, orange or red cards. They may have arrived home with a star of the

day/student of the week certificate, or are now proudly sporting a pink, yellow or blue badge and as end of term draws near hear talk about upcoming end of term movie or park visit.

If you haven't quite got your head around how these all relate to each other – these are some of the tools used for teaching positive behaviour which is implemented primarily through our 3R's.



The rewards and milestones show your child understands our school rules and has demonstrated positive behaviour in relation to themselves, others and our environment. Be proud of their achievements.

What you may not realise is the amount of work the teachers put into administering, recording and following up in support of this programme and our children. Behind the rewards is a structured system of not only positive reinforcement planning and organising rewards, but restorative practice and corrective consequences for children who step over the boundary into unacceptable behaviour.

Since 2015 data show the number of behaviour incidents at school has almost halved

In future newsletters, I will present you a more in depth view of our school system which I hope will give you a better understanding of how it operates and how it benefits your children.



Each child registering for the programme will spend the equivalent of one day, broken into appropriate sessions and they will receive a take-home pack of fun, relevant equipment and games to use with family at home.

There will be a Whanau Finale at the end of the programme, with a family maths challenge and to celebrate the efforts of the participants with their families.

Registrations are open. However numbers will be limited within each of the 4 year bands, with a total of 50 places available.
