

I am investigating whether we have enough children to run a 'Season for Growth' programme at Carterton School next term. The programme is an education programme, it does not provide counselling or therapy.

Using the imagery of the seasons to illustrate the experience of grief, the course strengthens the social and emotional well-being of children who are dealing with significant changes in their life. For example: losing someone they love, family separation, moving to a new place, illness impacting on their life.

The programme is run for 6 - 8 year olds, 9 - 10 year olds and 11 - 12 year olds.

Parent-teacher interviews will be held at the following times:



To book your interviews, go to www.schoolinterviews.co.nz/code in your browser, and enter the event code **32279**. Then follow these three simple steps:




First enter your name, your student's name, and your email address.


