COMMUNITY CONSULTATION

At the beginning of this term, we asked whānau and our community to answer a range of questions in order to help us form a clear vision for Carterton School in 2020 and beyond. The teachers and leadership team worked to identify key trends and we have included these below ...

What do you want your student to achieve as a learner at Carterton School?

The key message was that whānau would like their students to have a balance of all curriculum areas, activities and experiences. Virtues, values, life and social skills were identified as important along with wellbeing and connectedness. Whānau feel that it is important that we prepare students academically for their next learning step.

What do you like about Carterton School and why? What might make it even better?

One key trend identified by whānau was that the teachers and support staff are approachable, caring, dedicated, supportive and know their child. Some would like future developments in the Year 7 + 8 program. Many appreciate the option of Ākonga Māori and it is a point of difference for our school.

Whānau have noticed and appreciate the recent improvements in our school discipline and would like this to continue in order to develop a positive culture and environment at Carterton School. The physical environment, both in and out of the classroom, and the size and location of the school, are seen as positive.

In developing our Carterton School local curriculum, what might be important to include?

Along with the essential literacy and Mathematics, Whānau identified that they would like their child/ren to be learning about different cultures, history, community, the environment, local trips and local events. STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics) was identified as an important area of learning.

Wellbeing is of high importance for many families, especially the areas of: mental health, kindness, empathy, awareness, respect, problem solving and life skills. Whānau are keen for Māori language to be taught along with developing an understanding of culture and New Zealand history.

What do you want for our Year Seven and Eight students at Carterton School?

Preparation for college was a key trend that whānau identified as important for Year Seven and Eight students at Carterton School, along with a broad curriculum that includes teaching about life skills, careers, and money. EOTC (Education Outside the Classroom) and other trips are seen as very important. Parents and community members are keen to ensure consistent staffing in the senior school with enthusiastic and engaging teachers and learning programmes. Whānau are keen for Year Seven and Eight students to have a range of leadership opportunities in order to promote our senior students and encourage them to be role models within our school and the wider community.

We would like to thank everyone who contributed their ideas via the paper survey or during Pet Day. Your feedback and ideas will be used as a key tool in setting the direction of our school. 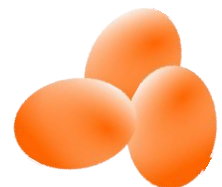
